United Way is here to provide you with everything you need to know to register a great project for this year's event.

Before you begin:

- All Day of Caring host organizations must be a 501c3 nonprofit, government office or school.
- Host organization AND project sites must be located within Erie County.
- All Day of Caring Projects must take place on June 21, 2023.

As a Day of Caring host agency, you agree to:

- Submit your project through United Way (no direct recruitment of volunteers).
- Provide all necessary materials and equipment needed to complete your project(s).
- Provide water to all volunteers for half- and full-day projects.
- Provide lunch to all volunteers for full-day projects.
- Follow all United Way safety guidelines for Day of Caring projects.
- Provide United Way with a copy of your organization's insurance certificate.
- Communicate with United Way and volunteer team leader(s) prior to the event.
- Assign an agency project coordinator to be on site for the duration of your project.
- Display United Way Day of Caring signage during your project (provided by UWBECE)
- Promote Day of Caring peer-to-peer fundraising.

Project Length:

- Choose to host a half- or full-day project.
- Half-day projects are from 9 a.m. -12 p.m. or 1 p.m. - 4 p.m.
- Full day projects are from 9 a.m. - 4 p.m.

United Way's Role:

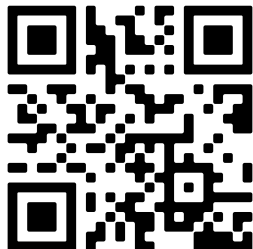
- Planning, administration and evaluation functions for Day of Caring
- Volunteer recruitment and assignment to projects
- Manage peer-to-peer fundraising portal and disbursement of funds raised
- Media Coverage
- Providing best practices and other resources

Project Approval:

Projects are accepted at the sole discretion of the United Way of Buffalo & Erie County. We reserve the right to exclude a project.

Please note that special emphasis and priority will be given to projects that are:

- Hosted by organizations whose community impact work includes at least one of the following United Way focus areas:
 - Healthy birth outcomes
 - Early learning and development
 - Childhood obesity
 - School-age learning
 - Employment and workforce development
 - Financial capability and asset building
 - Trauma-informed care.
- Located in UWBECC's 16 high priority zip codes, as identified in our 2021-2022 Investments RFP. Those zip codes are: 14201, 14202, 14203, 14204, 14206, 14207, 14208, 14209, 14210, 14211, 14212, 14213, 14215, 14216, 14218 and 14220.
